OTHER BUSINESS OR DISCUSSION

Crowley County applied for the Department of Local Affairs Energy and Mineral Impact Assistance Fund program and was awarded \$600,000 towards the construction of a new administrative building. Estimated project total is \$1,200,000 which includes demolition, construction of new building, and parking lot.

MONTHLY PRISON MEETING

The board conducted the monthly prison meeting with a representative of Crowley County Correctional Facility. No representatives attended from Arkansas Valley Correctional Facility. Those in attendance were:

CCCF: There are currently 1,431 beds filled at the facility with an additional 23 inmates arriving. Pod 5C is now open. There are two additional pods available for use in Unit 5 if the need arises. There are 16 correctional officer vacancies, and 14 correctional officers are starting today. There is one nurse vacancy. Crowley County Correctional Facility is one of eight facilities who are meeting employee retention goals. An ACA mock audit will be performed this week and the formal audit will be in September.

No further business appearing the meeting was recessed.
